#### SCHOOL POLICIES

- The School begins at 8:15 a.m for the students. All students are expected to reach school before the bell rings. After 8:15 a.m. the school gates will be closed.
- Self-discipline is the forte of the school.
- Students should observe polite civil behaviour, ragging, screaming or use of unparliamentarily languages is forbidden.
- Students should maintain cleanliness and hygiene within the school campus. Littering is prohibited.
- St. Paul's Public School constitutes a family of students from various communities, religious and linguistic groups. The medium of instruction and communication is English in the school campus.
- Under no pretext should a student miss any teaching / games / activity period.
- The school is not responsible for any loss of student's belonging in the premises. Students should not remain in the classroom during break time without a written request from their parents. Students should also not leave the premises during the school working hours.
- Changing classrooms between periods should be done in silence and in an orderly manner. Students are expected to move quietly in a single line without causing any disturbance to other classes.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT

We expect our students to maintain high standards of personal conduct. This includes personal honesty, discipline, integrity, humility, ethnics and values. Students are accountable to the school authorities for their conduct in the school premises, for their general behaviour outside, while in the school transport and at all school approved events or activities. Any objectionable conduct on the part of the student will lead to commensurate consequences, at the discretion of the Principal, whose decisions on such matters are final.

The following undesirable behaviour/ repeated indiscipline will lead to serious consequences.

- \* Graffiti on the walls / school furniture / library books.
- \* Obscenity in use of words or acts and indulging in uncivilized behaviour
- \* Damaging school furniture, fixtures / buildings or belongings.
- \* Irregular attendance.
- \* Insubordination to any member of the staff inside or outside the school.
- \* Scribbling or writing anything on the school uniform.

- \* Bullying, gossiping, playing pranks or using any form of physical / emotional violence against a fellow student.
- \* Indulging in any misbehaviour / misdeed directly or online this could be derogatory for the institution or any person.
- \* Using unfair means during a test / examination.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS**

- \* Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- \* Closely monitor your ward's progress by checking the school almanac everyday and paying attention to their punctuality, discipline and submission of school assignments. Parents are requested to use the space provided in the almanac for any communication with the teachers.
- \* Inform the school if there is any change in address, telephone numbers and bus route.
- \* Restrict pocket money to minimal.
- \* Ensure that your ward does not bring expensive items, electronics items, cell phones etc or large sum of money to school. The school bag should be randomly checked to ensure the same.
- \* Restrict celebration of birthday of your ward in school to distribution of dry fruits or fruits only. We suggest a library book with imprints of parent's name and address. Elaborate arrangements like cutting of cake and partying in the school are not permitted.
- \* Explain to the child the need to look after his / her belongings. The school does not accept responsibility for any item lost in school. All articles belonging to the child should have identification details.
- \* Support and co-operate with the school authorities in enforcing discipline by making sure that your children attend school regularly, do the assignments, devote sufficient time to reading and revising their lessons at home and take interest in all the activities of the school.
- \* Ensure that your ward is in proper school uniform. No fancy jewellery like danglers, trinkets, studs, rings etc, should be worn by girls / boys.
- \* Ensure that during your ward's absence from school, work done in the class is made up for.

- \* Keep 'leave for a day' to minimal as far as possible. In case of an emergency, written permission must be taken from the Principal / Vice Principal / Class Teacher. In case a child leaves the school early, it is mandatory to inform the bus in charge about the same.
- \* Provide a supportive value based environment to your ward at home. Using discretion and parental judgement keep track of the ward's mental health and emotions.
- \* Monitor the internet sites being visited by your ward and limit television viewing to appropriate programs.
- \* Sign the corrected answer scripts of assessments that are sent home and return to the school within three days of the date of issue.
- Private tuition for the students without the permission of the Principal is strictly prohibited. When it is found necessary parents and the Principal may jointly discuss and take the remedial measure for the students who need personal coaching.
- \* Sign in blue or black ink all the reports, notice and class work / books of your wards when required to do so.
- \* Be formally dressed when you are in the school premises.
- Discourage your wards to take leaves before the commencement of examinations as these days are important as far as preparation is concerned.
- \* Avoid any kind of criticism of the child's teacher or the school in his / her presence as children may lose respect for their teachers and consequently fail to learn from them.
- \* Note Cell phones are strictly not permitted within the school premises.

### **PAYMENT OF FEES**

- For the academic year 2023-24, Maintenance fees, Computer fees/ Coding Class Fees, Lab fees, Yearly fee, Activity fee. (where applicable) etc, must be paid in the month of May/June in one instalment.
- Fees can be paid either by cash for online or by Demand draft or pay order drawn in the favour of Principal, St. Paul's School, payable at Bengaluru. Cheques are not accepted. Fees paid after the due date may attract a late fee.
- 3. The school tuition fee / Yearly fee is charged for one academic year.
- 4. The prescribed fees should be paid at the office from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm and the receipt should be collected for the same
- 5. The fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.

#### ATTENDANCE & REGULARITY

All students must be present on the re-opening day and closing day of each term. The names of the students who are absent on these days will be struck off the rolls and the parents will have to seek Re-admission for their children if they want to continue in the school.

The students must have 75% of Attendance (Physical presence for full duration) to take up the examination as per the CBSE examination Bye-Laws. Condonation of attendance may be considered by following the Rules and Regulations of the Board applicable from time to time.

If a student is absent even for one day when resuming to school he/she must inform the Principal in writing. The Parent must state the reason for her/his absence in the absent or leave record of the school diary.

Students who are ill on the day of assessments are advised to come to school only if they can stay for the entire duration of the morning or the afternoon session. Once the students are in the school they are required to stay for the full length of the school day. Students are not permitted to arrive or leave in between morning / afternoon sessions. In case of any emergency, parents are required to call up the school and inform the absence of their ward and follow it up with a written leave letter.

#### ADMISSION & WITHDRAWAL

Applications for admission are accepted as and when notified in the school website. Parents wishing to withdraw their children at the end of the academic year must inform the Principal in writing before the end of February. Failing the school leaving certificates will be issued only after the school re-opens. It will not be issued until all the dues are fully paid and all library books are returned.

#### **UNIFORM**

- All students must be neatly dressed in full school uniform whenever they are in the school premises.
- Students are required to wear black shoes and white socks on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and white canvas shoes, white socks on Wednesday, Saturday and PT days.
- Boys should wear vests and girls should wear slips and cycling shorts.
- Any clothes other than uniform are not allowed.

#### Boys are not permitted to:

- ♦ Have long side burs, long hair, streaked hair and fancy hair styles.
- Wear bands/ bracelets / chains / ear rings
- Grow their beared, moustache.

#### Girls are not permitted to:

- Have streaked hair, fancy hair styles. leave shoulder length or long hair untied.
- Wear eye makeup and more than one ear piercing.
- Wear gold /diamond ear-rings, bangles and colourful chains and fancy jewellery, long ear-rings.
- Adorn their hair with flowers or colourful clips, paint their nails or apply mehendi.

#### **USE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

- Students are permitted to use the computers at school for any purpose pertaining to the requirements of the school syllabus as specified by the computer faculty or for any school activity only.
- Students are not allowed to send messages on the network, create or view objectionable visuals, change system setting or delete files.
- Students who engage in cyber bullying by posting email, blogs, video footage, images, photographs on social networking sites, chat rooms, You Tube,SMS, MMS which are
- Violent, aggressive or threatening.
- Vulgar or obscene.
- Malicious rumours or gossip, classified as teasing or taunting.
- Verbally attacking, embarrassing or maligning causing mental trauma or psychological damages by destroying the reputation of staff or students.
- Tarnishing the image of the school.

Shall invite severe disciplinary action and are liable to be suspended from class or expelled from school.

### **USE OF ELECTRONIC GADGETS**

Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones, I pods, I stations, PSPs, cameras or any other electronic gadgets to school. If they do so, it will be confiscated. Students are permitted to use the office telephone to contact their parents in times of emergency.

## **LUNCH AND SNACKS BREAKS**

Students should bring lunch baskets with the necessary cutlery, water and napkin to maintain personal hygiene

Parents, guardians, drivers or housekeepers are not allowed to the school premises to hand over lunch boxes.

Parents are advised to send enough food for their wards, as children are not permitted to leave the campus at anytime during the school hours.

Note: Students should get Lunch along with them

#### **PARKING**

Students are advised to alight from their vehicles 10-15 meters away from the school gate. Parents and drivers who park in front of the school gate while letting their children alight, cause congestion and confusion at the gate. Adequate place should be allowed in front of the school gate for comfortable movement of children School authorities are not responsible for the loss of vehicles.

#### **VACATION**

School works on a six - day week schedule, Saturday will be a half day unless required making up for the loss of academic hours due to unforeseen circumstances. Parents are requested to refer to the school almanac/calendar before planning the vacation and booking tickets.

#### **HOUSE SYSTEM**

The school has a house system to foster spirit of co-operation and healthy competition. There are four houses in the school - Red, Green, Blue and Yellow, Every student admitted is placed in one of these houses from Grade I.

#### **Scheme of Assessment**

St. Paul's school is affiliated to CBSE, Govt of India, New Delhi follows the curriculum and system of assessment as directed by the CBSE Board from time to time CBSE has decided to implement the uniform system of Assessment, Exam pattern and issue of report card, keeping in view the provision of RTE 2009. The scheme of examination has been designed on Term assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as student move forward.

This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of grade 10<sup>th</sup> Board examination and would thus ensure the quality fo education.

#### Scheme of Assessment for Pre-School and Pre - Primary Classes

Evaluation of learning is a comprehensive process as it focuses on the daily, consistent progress made by the child. This procedure is based on the child's daily interaction in the class, his/her levels of general awareness, the quality of work produced by him / her and internalization of the concepts taught. The approach is purely academic, but attaches equal importance to participation in co-curricular activities.

Students of Grade 1 to 5 are assessed through examination conducted periodically and undergo a Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment process through the academic year. Report card stating the student's performance are issued once in each term.
